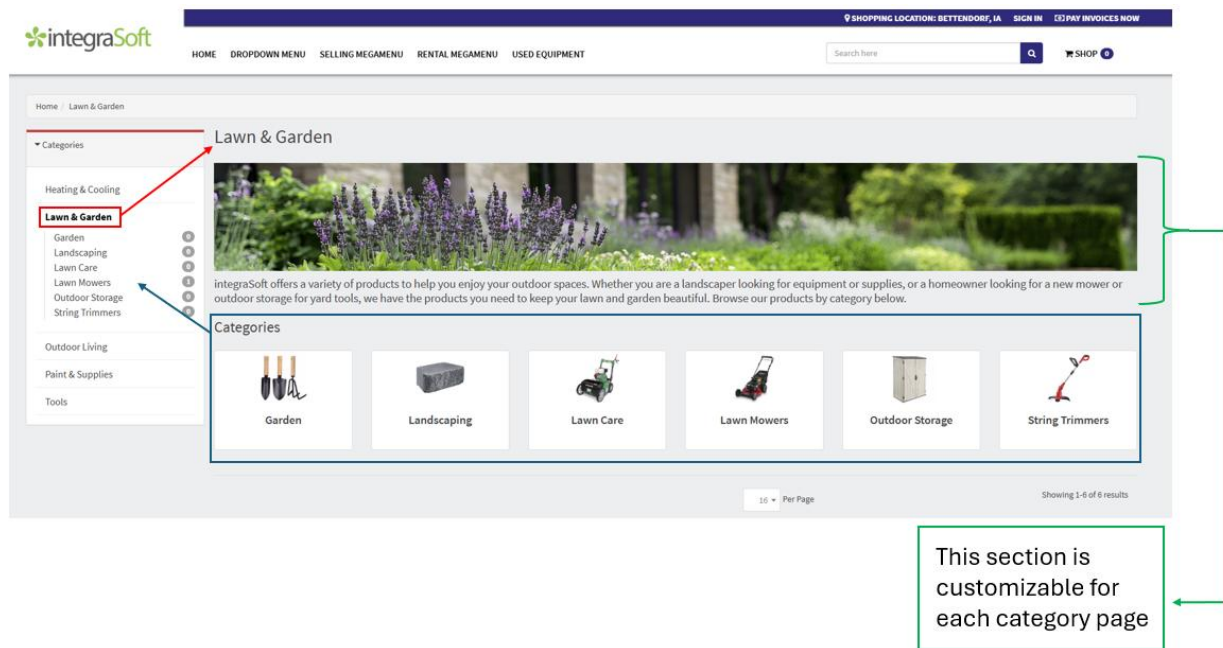


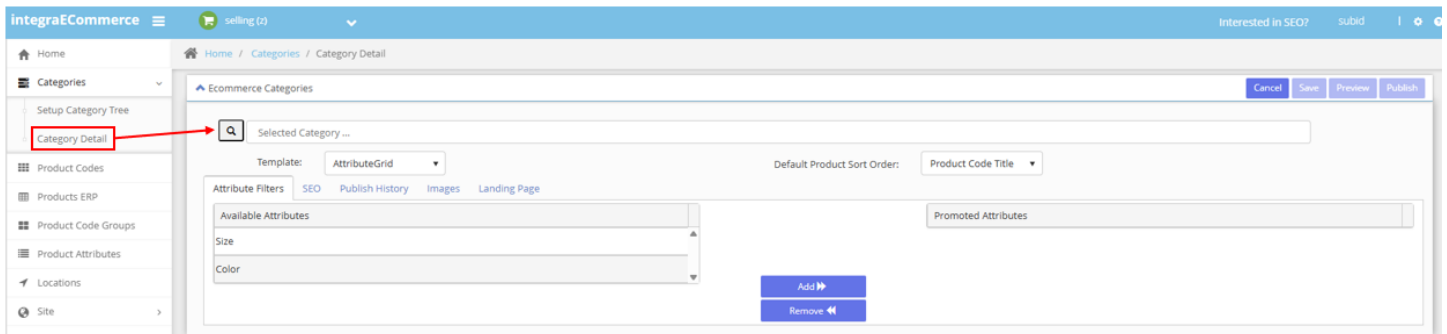
Category Pages

You can use customize category pages with text, photos, links, product carousels, videos, and more depending on your level of html/css coding skill. It is easy to customize the category pages with no knowledge of coding.


Category Pages may contain customizations as well as thumbnails of sub-categories nested within them, and/or product code page thumbnails.




You can edit the customizable section of each category page by going to....
iNextAdmin > Categories > Category Detail Page



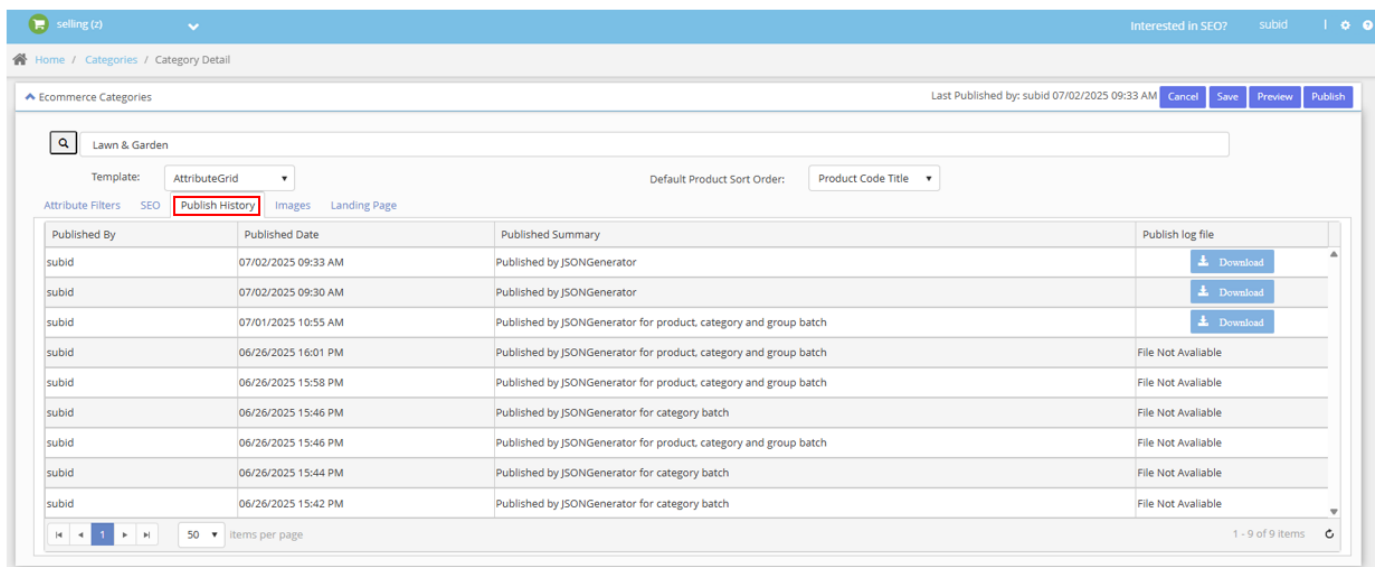
Click the magnifying glass to navigate through the category tree
..and then double click on a category to edit it.



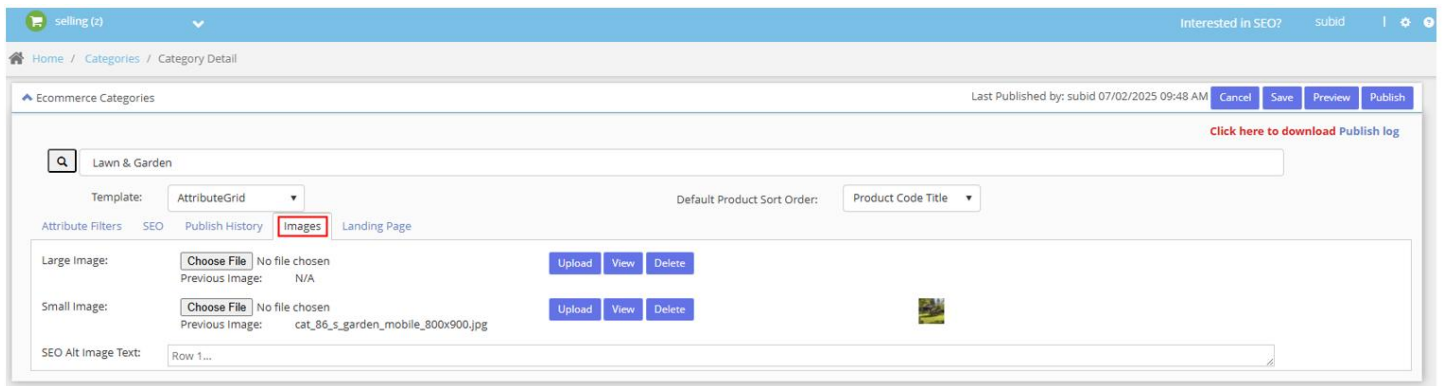
Attribute Filters Tab – this tab enables you to showcase product code attributes as “Promoted Attributes.” By moving an attribute from the left side to the right side, that attribute will show on the product code page and allow filtering of product code page thumbnails based on the attributes assigned. For example, if this Lawn & Garden page were a string trimmer page, and the products were a combination of gas and electric (corded and battery), then a user could filter the product thumbnails on the page based on those assigned attributes. SEO Tab – Those with SEO know-how can update the meta data for individual category pages. The canonical URL is automatically updated based on the category page title. You can also set a category page as no index or no follow by checking the boxes.

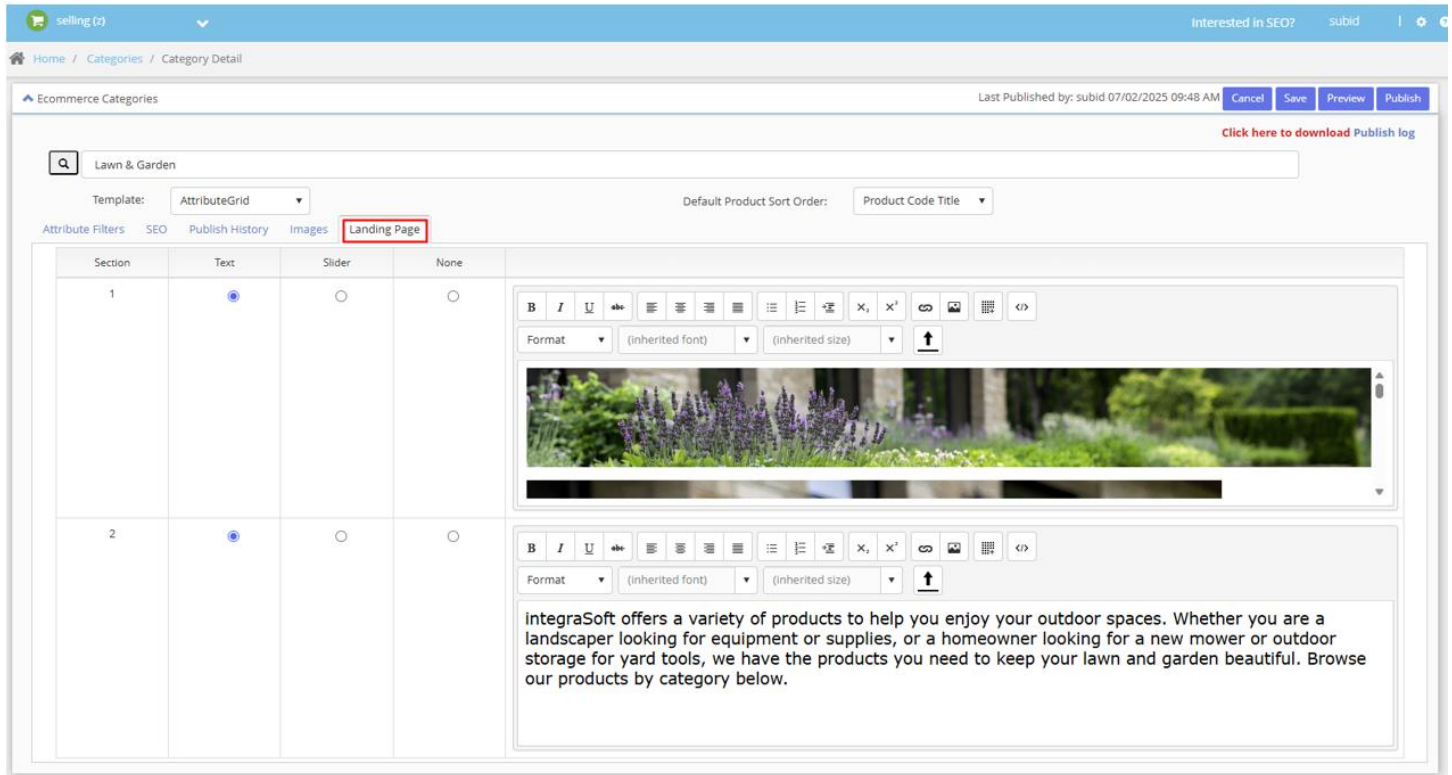


Publish History Tab – this shows the publish history including username and date for when the category page was published. You can save/publish a category page by clicking the buttons in the top right corner of the page.



Images Tab – Here you can upload both a large image and a small image. When you upload a large image, it is shown above the custom content added to the landing page (next tab over). Our customers typically do not use the large image here, but it is available. The small image, when uploaded, is what shows on the category thumbnail (when the category exists as a subcategory, or in the mega menu). SEO alt image text may be added for the images.





Landing Page Tab – this section allows you to utilize two different modules with your choice between none, product carousel slider, or text. When the none radial button is selected, no content will be shown on the category page (for that module) after publishing. When the Slider radial button is selected, you may choose from a drop-down menu of product groups to showcase it's assigned product code pages as a product carousel – this is typically not used by our customers on category pages (typically only used on the site's main landing page). When the text radial button is selected, as shown in the above image, you may use the rich text editor to add/customize styling of text, add images, links, and more.

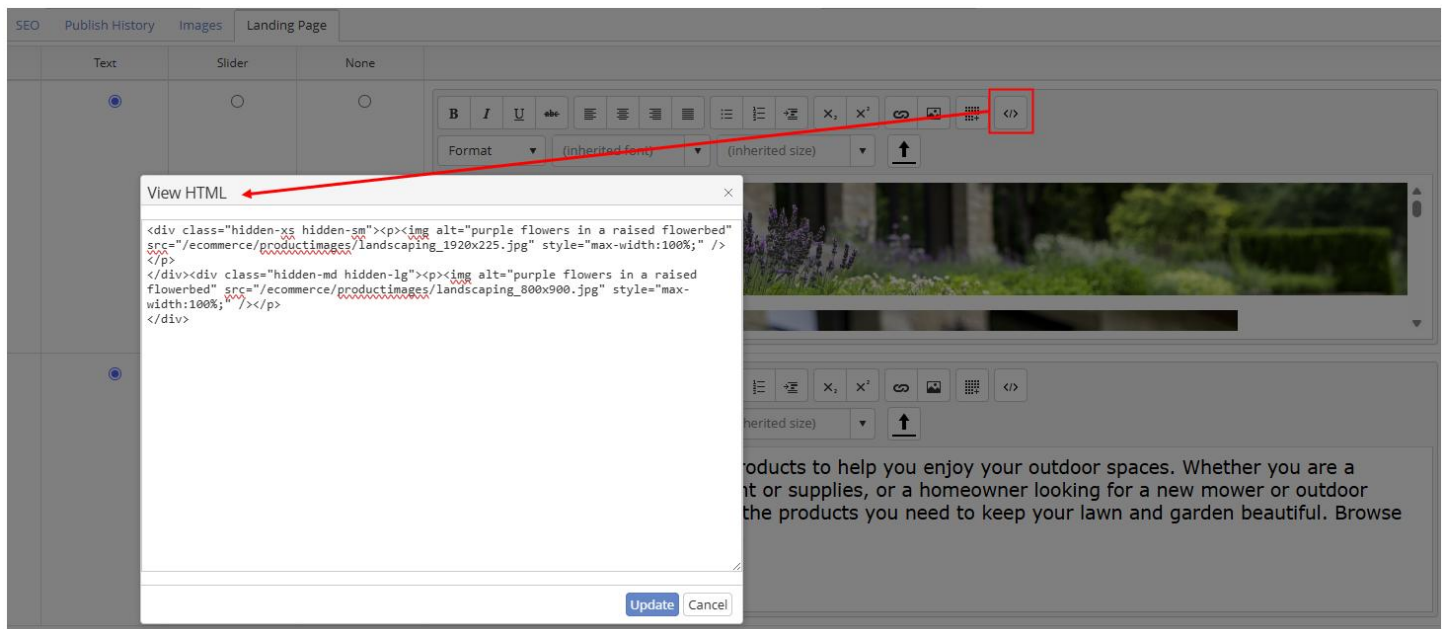

Included on all of the rich text editors is a `</>` button, shown below, that allows you to view/modify the html of that section. On the Lawn & Garden category detail page's first module, we actually have two images. One image will only show only on desktop view and the other image will only show on mobile view.



To hide content from mobile view... add this before and after your content.. for example:

The highlighted code below hides everything in between from being shown on mobile view:

<div class="hidden-xs hidden-sm"><p> </p> </div>
```

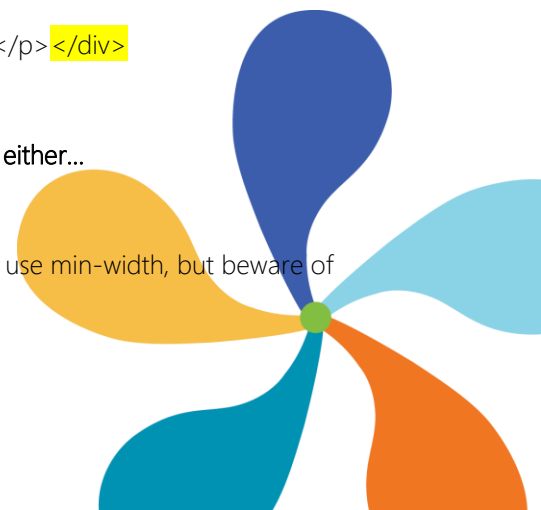
The highlighted code below hides everything in between from being shown on desktop view:

```
<div class="hidden-md hidden-lg"><p> </p> </div>
```

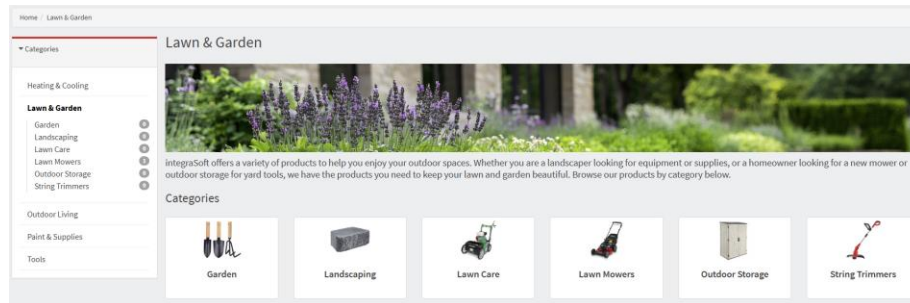
The code to make an image the full width of the page can be added, as shown above, as either...

`style="max-width:100%;"` OR `style="min-width:100%;"`

...depending on the size of the image. If a large image, use max-width, if a smaller image, use min-width, but beware of resolution issues that could occur from stretching the image larger than it normally is.

For those with HTML/CSS skills, the sky is the limit on the customizations you can add to the category page's landing page modules.

Once you've finished making changes to a category page, click the Save and Publish buttons in the top right corner of the page and then you'll be able to view the updates on your eRental site. You may need to execute a hard refresh (CTRL+F5) on the category page to view any changes. If you don't see the changes after that, try clearing your cache and cookies or opening the site in an incognito tab.

If you are making a lot of changes, you can always save and move on to the next thing and then run a full site publish after you've completed and saved all of your changes..
